What is acquired brain injury?

The term acquired brain injury (ABI) refers to any brain damage sustained after birth.

Potential causes of ABI are varied and include strokes, physical traumas such as falls and motor vehicle accidents, and brain diseases including Parkinson's and multiple sclerosis. They can happen to anyone.

An ABI is not the same as an intellectual disability,

and many people make a significant recovery through rehabilitation.

People with acquired brain injury are not always recognised as having a form of disability, because their injuries are often hidden.

What is Brain Injury SA?

Brain Injury SA is the peak body in South Australia, representing people with ABI and their families.

Brain Injury SA identifies needs and advocates for action on issues that cause disadvantage, delivers specialised programs and services, and gives a voice to people with ABI.

Governed by a Board of volunteers and led by a chief executive, Brain Injury SA is supported by a small and dedicated team at their Light Square offices.

How can Brain Injury SA help your organisation?

Brain Injury SA provides tailored training services that equip staff with the skills, strategies and knowledge to work more effectively with people with ABI.
